THE SHEMA

Deuteronomy 6: 4 - 5 Hear (Shema), O Israel (Adonai); The Lord (Adonai) our God, the lord (Adonai) is one. You shall love the LORD (Adonai) your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

The Shema may be something many people in the Christian world have not heard off and wonder what it is about. I came across this during my personal devotions many years ago and I often say this at the beginning of my week.

The Shema is a daily morning and evening prayer for our Jewish believers. This reading is found in Deuteronomy (OT – fifth book) and is an affirmation of God's kingship. For the Jews it is a tradition observant.

When they say this prayer, they recite with their hand placed over their eyes. This helps them concentrate while saying the important words in the Shema, which express faith in God and God's unity. This is the same for us, when we pray to God, we encourage people to close their eyes to help focus of God.

The Shema gets its name from the first Hebrew word of the prayer – "Hear" or "listen". It occurs when Moses was talking to the Israelites to prepare them as they entered the promise land. Moses is encouraging the Israelites not to make the same mistakes as their parents while they were wondering around in the wilderness for 40 years. He is wanting them to experience the full blessing of the promised land and to do this the people must learn to listen to and love God fully. Which is still the same for us today. To listen to God and to trust Him fully.

I love this prayer as Jesus would have said the same words. It's a beautiful prayer and saying these words helps me to keep God's love and loyalty in the forefront of my mind and also helps me with obedience and trust in God.

John 14: 21 - Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the lone who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him.

When we follow Jesus, we discover more of His love in our lives and when we respond to His love, it guides us to have a thankful heart, humility, and a command to go and love others.

I came across an illustration awhile ago (not sure where), it was talking about the Shema during WW11


After the war had ended there was an orphanage. One day there was a knock at the door and a Rabbi came to collect his children. The answer given back to him was "There are no Jewish children here". The Rabbi said he would come back at 6pm. This he did and was in the room where the children were. He started to say the Shema. The children started to lift their right hand to cover their eyes and said the pray.

The Rabbi said I will take, "This child, this child, this child", and so on. The Rabbi knew his children.

This is the same with God. When we prayer, when we trust, when we obey His words God says, "I know my Child".

Maybe you would like to start today and say the SHEMA. God bless and AMEN.





> Despite the melancholy surroundings, the graveyard sermons became a big success and the location became the first Salvationists' base of operations, providing an unlikely point of origin.












