### JESUS-CENTRED, SPIRIT-LED, HOPE REVEALED'

# The Salvation Army Australia Territory has issued a 'rallying cry' as a callback to its Army roots.

The rallying cry is 'Jesus-centred, Spirit-led, hope revealed'. The rallying cry isn't intended to add even more to our mission, vision, and values, but instead serves as a measure to draw them all together as we ask ourselves in all we do:

'Is Jesus central to this?'
'Where is the Spirit leading us?'
'Where am I seeing hope revealed?'

### JESUS-CENTRED

Jesus is our source. Jesus is our lifeforce. Jesus is our reason for living, loving, and fighting.

We live according to the ways of Jesus as outlined in the Gospel accounts. We love according to the example set throughout the Bible by the Saviour who laid his life down for us. We fight using spiritual discernment (Ephesians 6), by the power of our Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8) and not in our own strength or ways (Philippians 2:13).

#### SPIRIT LED

To be led by the Holy Spirit requires great discernment without distraction (Ephesians 5:1-25), discipline without detraction (Acts 15:28), and conviction that leads to action (Acts 2:1-37). Spiritual development, prayer and fasting, discipleship and accountability, prophetic gifts and testing of the word, time in teaching and learning, devotions, worship, retreats: whatever the practice, all of our ways must lead to listening to God and obeying God's voice as evidenced through the Holy Spirit

#### HOPE REVEALED

We are to be an 'Isaiah 61, Luke 4' people. The Spirit of the sovereign Lord is on us. We have to make sure, first and foremost, that this is true. We are to be 'oaks of righteousness' (Isaiah 61:3). The people of God have to put their roots down deep. They've got to be places where people want to come and shelter, where people find refuge, where we can sit and talk and explore together.

As we stay faithful to God's will and workings in The Salvation Army, whatever expression, mission, ministry and part of the movement we are in, we will truly live out our rallying cry, 'Jesus-centred, Spirit-led, hope revealed.' and share Good News. Over the coming months we will be focusing on the 11 Salvation Army doctrines. These are our statements of faith if you like. They unite the International Salvation Army. They are for everyone who calls The Salvation Army church home.

I have taken this from our Handbook of Doctrines:

Some people may wonder why Salvationists place such emphasis upon a written statement of faith. At the heart of Christianity is the believer's relationship with Jesus Christ, which is deeply personal and may often elude definition. Yet it is also inescapably communal and will flourish best in fellowship with other believers. Through the centuries the Church has learned to express the common experience of faith, in ways that are consistent with the biblical witness, in creeds and statements of faith.

For Salvationists, belief and action have always been intertwined. Our faith and practice are rooted in the Bible, personal experience, and the Christian heritage. Salvation Army doctrine is part of that heritage, and it too is built upon the foundation of the biblical text as interpreted by the people of God.

Doctrine is therefore the teaching of the Church. It is an expanded explanation of faith, founded on Scripture and developed from the creeds. The Salvation Army's 11 Articles of Faith (Doctrines) are an expression both of personal faith and a common vision. They are consistent with the classical Christian creeds and identify Salvationists as members of the body of Christ on earth.

The doctrines explore and define our understanding of God, humanity, and the developing relationship of the Christian life, and are best understood when this pattern is kept in mind. They are unique to The Salvation Army, yet they share a common emphasis with other Christian traditions. They are the foundation of faith, providing a benchmark which helps us to interpret and judge experience in order that we might best live our faith in our own context.


