LOCAL MISSION PLAN

Every Mission Expression in The Salvation Army has a Local Mission Plan (LMP). The LMP asks leaders and teams to consider how their team addresses the national mission. At Parramatta Salvos, our Corps Leadership Team writes the LMP each year, based on an assessment of the needs of our faith community and wider community. The plan below highlights our goals and we are pleased to let you know that those listed in green have already been achieved in 2024. Goals that are yet to be met will be rolled over to 2025.

Parramatta Corps Local Mission Plan 2024

Caring for People

We would like to increase opportunities for people to connect with small groups - both regular Sunday attendees and our community members.

- Review and relaunch of Life Groups: we will have a new promotional campaign for Life Groups in Term 1, reviewing existing groups, reforming groups and initiating new groups. This will correspond with a preaching series about Life Groups and discipleship.
- Development of Care Groups: PCC have been working on developing Care Groups for those
 who are not connected to a ministry group or Life Group. PCC to formalise these groups and
 appoint facilitators. These groups won't meet together, but look out for and pastorally care for
 one another.
- Faith Seminars: Quarterly seminars on interesting/current topics open to all church and community members. These may be another point of connection for people who are not in a Life Group.

Creating Faith Pathways

We would like to review all young people's ministries at Parramatta Corps.

- Employ a YP worker for kids/youth/families ministries and to initiate partnerships with local schools and community groups to grow our YP ministries.
- Review all YP programs (internal and external), gaining input from current families and the needs of our wider community.
- Focus on leader resourcing, development and consultation throughout the process to ensure we capture the voices of those who have been involved in youth and kids ministries over many years.

Building Healthy Communities

We would like to revision and streamline seniors programs at Parramatta Salvos to make programs sustainable.

- Begin a new program [Seniors Gathering] once a month combining Ladies Fellowship/
 Golden Years-type-program for all older persons.
- Build team to facilitate this program and take responsibility for events.
- Extend invitation to this program to wider community including Market Day community.

Working for Justice

We would like to develop volunteer programs and engagement at Parramatta Salvos.

- Employ a Community Engagement Worker responsible for volunteer engagement.
- Develop a volunteer management structure including recruitment, training, rostering and ongoing volunteer support.
- Increase volunteer connection, engagement and education. We would like to see more connection between weekday volunteers and church members.

ZEstablished Life Groups

Life Groups continue to meet and some have reformed in 2024. Life Groups are an excellent way to connect with others in our faith community, and a wonderful source of care and support.

PRAYER NEWSLETTER & CARDS



30 People subscribed This year we have grown our prayer newsletter. We have received prayer requests from our community members who use our prayer cards which are available in the foyer and from our church family.

Through this newsletter we have been able to make contact with the person who needed prayer if they give their information to be contacted. We then have been able offer help in a practical way.

The Pastoral Care Council and those who are faithful prayers know that the material things are temporary, but our prayers for another person can affect them for a lifetime.

LIVING WELL COMMUNITY

This ministry is still being shaped by our team and community pastor, Jonathan. There is a growing sense of community, especially around our cafe, and it is our hope to build on this further in 2025. Counselling support has been provided to 7 members of our wider corps community, 2 people who have been referred through Moneycare and 2 others who have sought emergency support throughout the week. Some of these have been once-off sessions and others have been met with on a more regular basis.



THE SANCTUARY COURSE

How can a church become a sanctuary—a place where individuals living with mental health challenges feel safe, supported, and a sense of belonging? The Sanctuary Course was created to inspire and equip communities of faith that are asking this important question. Developed in consultation with mental health professionals, theologians, and people with lived experience, this eight-session study guide explores key mental health topics and examines meaningful ways to offer companionship, support recovery, and promote wellbeing.

Run by Jonathan Browning, this course is for anyone who wants to learn about faith and mental health. Now the third year that Parramatta Salvos has run this course, it requires no previous training or expertise—just a willingness to engage in dialogue with other believers. This year 7 people participated in the 8 week course.

FAITH SEMINARS

This year we introduced Faith Seminars to open up discussion around current topics of interest in our world. Facilitated by Clayton Spence, these seminars gave insight into a biblical and Salvation Army perspectives on current issues, while also opening up discussion from people within the group.

CREATIVE MINISTRIES

Our creative teams play a vital role in creating an atmosphere of worship for us each Sunday. We have many talented people who contribute through our ensemble, brass band and tech team. We also have a diverse preaching team and a significant amount of church members who contribute by reading the word of God on our Bible Reading roster.







Ensemble

We are fortunate to have many gifted musicians at Parramatta who continue to lead us into a space where we can connect with God. Our Ensemble enable this to happen in our 9.30am service each week and we are grateful for the way they use their talents for the glory of God. This year has seen some new members join the group, adding new voices. Once again Easter and Christmas have been significant times of worship for us, made all the more powerful through the worship music.





Brass Band

The core function of our band is to support the Sunday worship service. The broader role is providing a wider community presence for the Corps in a number of ways. At various times during the year and in the Christmas concert, our band combines with other musical groups in the corps demonstrating the extra dimensions that can be added when diverse musical groups exist. This year our band was able to support the community by playing at the ANZAC Dawn Service, the Remembrance Day Service at Prince Alfred Park, the Christmas Carol Service at Kurrajong, monthly services for the residents of The Willows regular service for the residents of Constitution Hill and the Christmas Carol Service at Dooralong.

Tech Team

The Tech Team supports many events and activities within our church. Our team of 13 serves diligently across audio, presentation, and live streaming. In 2024 we welcomed two new team members. In the last 12 months our live streams have been watched on YouTube for more than 2,000 hours and over 1,000 hours on Facebook. For every 1 person who gathers in-person at our church on a Sunday there are at least 3 other people joining us online.

YOUNG PEOPLE

In 2024, we combined the 2 sections Mini God Squad and Kids Church into one Children's Ministry section called Sunday Squad. This operates during the 9:30am service during the school term. We have been blessed this year with new friends joining us as we learn more about God's plan for us and how we can serve Him.



Our Youth have joined with other Salvos across Sydney for UNITED events, and 9 campers travelled to our State Youth Camp this year for NSW/ACT. We also had a group of young adults attend Interstate Basketball and Netball Carnival.





MERCY SEAT REBUILD

At our 140th Celebrations we were able to dedicate our new mercy seats. Isaac Bust and Anthony Eden took on this project with funds donated by the Coia and Robinson family in memory of our dear friend Margaret Robinson. We celebrate and thank Isaac and Anthony for contributing to our citadel in this significant way. The new mercy seats feature timber from the Smith Street mercy seats, as well as the new timber from our current worship hall.





SALVOS COMMUNITY CONNECT

This year, our building continues to be open to the community 5 days a week. Salvos Community Connect is a space for people to come and access our cafe and services. Our Community Café operates on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday, providing free coffee and cold drinks, snacks, and a safe space for people to connect. On Wednesday we are also able to provide a meal for community members as they wait for our Market. On Tuesday and Thursdays, an instant tea and coffee station is provided and community members are welcome to sit and enjoy our space.

On Monday and Friday volunteers also hand out Emergency Relief gift cards provided by the Salvos Phone Assistance Line (PAL).

We love that Community Connect is staffed by volunteers and supported by our Community Program Coordinator, and other wrap-around services like our Doorways Caseworker and Moneycare Financial Counsellors.







COMMUNITY MARKET

Each week on Wednesday, people visit our Community Market. For a \$2 donation, people can access fresh produce and pantry items donated through our partnerships with Second Bite and Food Bank. This year we've had a hairdresser on site at no cost, to cut hair twice a month on Market Day.

Both the Community Connect and the Community Market are funded by our Red Shield Appeal funds and corporate donations.

This year we've also enjoyed monthly volunteer appreciation lunches sponsored by Nando's monthly, and volunteer outings.

Our collaborative partnerships:

- Second Bite (Coles): provide free meat, fresh produce and grocery items
- Food Bank: provide fresh produce and grocery items at a low cost
- Nike Parramatta: provide free returned shoes and clothing in wearable condition
- Bunnings Northmead & Rydalmere: provide free goods for transportation of market items
- Local business and schools: provide food and cash donations
- Ginger Restaurant, Harris Park: grocery items and hot meals
- Good 360: clothes, mobile phones and SIM cards



ENGLISH CONVERSATION GROUPS

People with various levels of English come together to learn new words and English sayings; growing their vocabulary and conversational skills. People also come along to meet friends and connect in meaningful ways. This important ministry has been going for more than 30 years, and we have even empowered some who were participants to be leaders of small groups. Some participants remain after the class to participate in a bible study, and this group has also grown in 2024!





CRAFT GROUP

This year we saw our 100th craft group attendee! Some have joined as a result of their connection with Parramatta Salvos through the cafe or Connect Site, but primarily members are invited to attend by others who attend the group.

The Craft Group is very welcoming and friendly. Some come just to talk while others knit, crochet, paint, draw, colour in, cross stitch, do diamond art or hardanger. Some are very skilled while others come to learn from other members of the group. The group has also been raising funds through donations for craft materials to give to different projects.





SENIORS GATHERINGS

Our Seniors Gathering commenced in March this year and each month the group has gathered for either an in-house guest speaker or an outing. We have visited Old Government House in Parramatta Park, enjoyed presentations from Ron Inglis on Salvation Army Anzacs and Paul on the History of Rock and Roll, as well as visited several cafes in the area. This is a wonderful group of fellowship, where people can connect in an informal way.





OUTREACH SERVICES


Each month, Parramatta Corps is given the opportunity to lead the Christian service at The Willows Retirement Village. Our brass band supports this service musically, and this year a roster of 8 different people from our corps accepted the invitation to lead the service. This is a wonderful ministry opportunity that brings together the residents of the village, many of whom are unable to get to regular church services. Our band also supports the Christian gatherings at Constitution Hill Village quarterly, which provide music and a bible message for residents, and frequently has more than 90 people in attendance.


TENANTS AND VENUE HIRE

Our building comprises five separate shop fronts on the Ground Floor, with Church facilities and areas leased to other Salvation Army functions on Level 1. Of the six tenancies, five are currently leased with the final one available for tenancy.

Over the past 6 months, the sales and leasing team have been showing potential tenants through the vacant shop. We hope to have this leased in 2025 to generate additional income. We are also working at expanding our capacity for weekday venue hire of our beautiful facilities.

EXPENSES July 2023 to June 2024



Property Expenses include an increased contribution to our Property Maintenance Reserve (\$130k in FY24 v \$60k in FY23) and capital expense to fit-out Shop 5 (\$147k).
